Dear Mr.Sheehan,

I appreciate your efforts to address Endangered Species Act issues being brought to your attention. I am writing today regarding the American Burying Beetle (ABB) in an effort to get your help with it as well. Prior to your appointment at the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (Service), on February 22, 2017, IPAA filed a noticed of intent to sue the Service for failure to issue a 12-month finding on our petition to delist the federally endangered ABB. To date, the Service has not met this statutory deadline. IPAA now needs to formally submit our complaint and we wanted to inform you as a courtesy and provide some background information to you before we filed.

The ABB is the largest of the carrion beetles found in North America and was listed by the Service in 1989. At the time of the original listing, USFWS was unable to identify any actual threats to populations of the ABB and more recent analyses of threats are based largely on speculation and assumption rather than actual evidence. More recently, population and habitat viability modeling conducted by USFWS indicates that all naturally occurring wild populations of the ABB are of sufficient size to be demographically viable for the foreseeable future. This was the reason that on August 8, 2015, IPAA, along with the American Stewards of Liberty, and the Texas Policy Foundation filed a petition to delist the species. On March 16, 2016, the Service published a positive 90-day finding in the Federal Register based on its determination that the petitioned-for action may be warranted and initiated a status review. The Service's status review, which was due on August 8, 2016, is presumably ongoing. Correspondence from the Service received on April 24, 2017, indicated that the review of the Species Status Assessment (SSA) is underway. We further understand that a draft SSA is currently being reviewed and is heavily predicated on the presumed negative impacts of climate change.

Many land development, agriculture, transportation and utility operations have been delayed or restricted due the presence of the ABB at a cost of many millions of dollars, including \$1.3. million that the Oklahoma Department of Transportation alone spent on conservation actions during a six-year period. Furthermore, economic threats to the affected communities continue to cost private landowners, businesses, and local governments many millions.



The Summit brought together many of the nation's most influential advocates for hunters and anglers to discuss how to expand access and break down barriers.

conservation in America. But in the 21st Century, there are more challenges than ever for Americans to experience hunting and fishing opportunities - and to pass this vital heritage down to the next generation. Last week, we held an important gathering in Washington to catalyze partnership-driven efforts to change that.

While hunting and angling numbers still remain positive, this growth isn't keeping pace with that of the overall population. The average age of hunters and anglers has also increased, suggesting that younger Americans aren't taking up these sports to the degree that they once did. One of the limiting factors is providing access for new or returning hunters and anglers.

On his first day in office, Secretary Zinke issued Secretarial Order 3347 to initiate efforts to increase access for sportsmen throughout our nation. Last week's Summit built on this Secretarial Order, bringing leaders from leading sporting advocacy organizations and state and federal land management agencies together to discuss ways to expand hunter and angler access and engagement during the current administration.



Discussion focused on how we can better engage and inspire young hunters and anglers - and how the refuge and hatchery systems can play a vital role.


These leaders came to Washington on short notice because like us, they understand that wildlife and people across the nation will suffer if hunting, angling, boating, and shooting sports participation continues to decline.

Each year, millions of Americans spend billions of dollars to pursue their passion for these sports – purchasing equipment, food, lodging, licenses and a myriad of other products and services. These expenditures support thousands of jobs and pump billions of dollars into local communities across the nation. And as you know better than anyone, hundreds of native

fish and wildlife species have benefited from the habitat improvements and protections put in place for game species using sportsmen's dollars.

Especially at the state level, funding for conservation work depends on revenues from the sale of licenses and tags to hunters and anglers - as well as revenues from excise taxes on the sale of hunting and fishing equipment collected and distributed through our Wildlife and Sport Fish Restoration Programs.


When I became Director of the Utah Division of Natural Resources, I found out quickly that if we didn't sell enough licenses, we couldn't make payroll. The decline in hunting and angling participation has hurt every state wildlife agency in the nation, most of which have had to make significant cuts in employees and conservation work to make up for revenue shortfalls. That's why we need to bring a state-level sense of urgency and focus to this issue. Because without the capacity and expertise our state agency partners bring to the table, the Service can't succeed in its conservation mission.



Disabled Americans also deserve to be able to hunt and fish. They're a big part of efforts to expand access.

At the Summit, Secretary Zinke made it clear that he's willing to move heaven and earth to ensure that the Service and other Interior agencies make expanding access to hunting and fishing a central priority. As he noted, increasing hunting and fishing participation is directly linked to public lands access.

The Secretary's commitment was met by a passionate response from Summit participants, who spent several hours in breakout sessions identifying key actions to expand hunter and angler access, recruitment and retention that we can collectively implement as a conservation community.



In particular, participants emphasized the key role of the National Wildlife Refuge System and other federal public lands in

serving as the foundation for expanded recruitment and retention efforts. Expanding hunting and fishing access on public lands - and making information about those opportunities more easily available to the public through Apps, webbased databases and other easily accessible platforms will be key. Discussion also centered on using public lands as the hub of efforts to link habitat and hunting and fishing opportunities on private lands nearby.

And perhaps most important, participants placed significant emphasis on engaging nontraditional communities in hunting and angling - focusing on access for disabled Americans, and making hunting and fishing more accessible to urban residents. Summit facilitators are now compiling and summarizing the discussions, and we will use them to help guide where we go from here as a community.

We have a lot of work ahead of us to identify the best courses of action and begin to aggressively implement them. I'm excited that the Fish and Wildlife Service, and especially the National Wildlife Refuge System and National Fish Hatchery System, will be at the forefront of these efforts.

As I travel around the country, I'd love to hear your ideas on how we can expand hunting and fishing for generations to come. Let's get to work!

I need to clarify that the cabins under threat are not the public use cabins (though many of those have been shuttered and the USFS has discussed ending the program as budgets have been tightened).

The cabins we're discussing are the privately held cabins located upon USFS lands under special use permits. Many of these cabins are quite old and have been held by Alaskan families for many years. They are integral to the lifestyle of many local Alaskans.

The permits allow an individual to transfer a cabin one time. Typically this happens with the passing of one generation to the next. When the second permittee passes away, the USFS is not considering a new special use permit, but is simply knocking down the existing cabins.

The situation that brought this issue to light involves a cabin that has been transferred when the original permittee passed away. The next permitte (a son), recently passed away and now the adult grandchildren (long serving military veterans) of the original permittee are being forced to watch from the sideline while the USFS prepares to remove the structure.

It's difficult to properly summarize this issue in an email, but if someone with a sympathetic ear would be willing to talk to a friend of ours up there, he could pass along all the necessary information. He's taken a very active role in this issue and his thoughts are compelling.
