The Bureau Of Land Management Selected Grand Junction, Colorado, As The Site Of Its New Headquarters.

The Bureau Of Land Management's New Neighbors Include Chevron, Laramie Energy and Marathon Oil.

The New Bureau Of Land Management (BLM) Headquarters In Grand Junction, Colorado Is In A Building That Houses Extractive Interest Association And Companies. “The Bureau of Land Management has selected a site for its new headquarters in Grand Junction, Colo. — and it’s in a building that also serves as the home to a Chevron corporate office, a state oil and gas association and an independent natural gas exploration company. Trump officials decided in July to move the BLM — which oversees energy leasing, grazing and other activities on federal land — out of the District of Columbia. The move is to be completed by the end of next year.” [[Washington Post](#), 09/21/19]

- **Interior Secretary David Bernhardt Claimed Move Was About “Providing Better Service To The American People.”** “While the Interior Department is dispersing the employees to several states, the bureau’s top leadership will move to Grand Junction. ‘Standing up the headquarters is another step in providing better service to the American people and out neighbors in the West,’ said Interior Secretary David Bernhardt, who grew up in town of Rifle, an hour’s drive away from Grand Junction.” [[Washington Post](#), 09/21/19]
- **Interior Claimed The Space Would Be For National Senior Leadership And Support Staff.** “In a statement, the department said the lease at 760 Horizon Drive ‘will provide BLM with office space for national senior leadership and support staff,’ including 19 vacant staff positions that are now being advertised. “‘The lease terms will provide the bureau with significant cost savings compared to the current arrangement in D.C.,’ the statement said.” [[Washington Post](#), 09/21/19]
