Subject: Majority of Arizona Voters Disapprove of Trump's Management of Public Lands, Installment of Pendley as Acting Director of BLM

Date: September 21, 2020

A new Public Policy Polling survey finds that a majority of Arizona voters (51%) disapprove of President Trump's management of America's public lands, wildlife, clean water, clean air, and environment. Of those who disapprove, 46% strongly disapprove. In comparison, just 43% of voters approve of Trump's management of the environment and public lands in America.

Additionally, 58% of Arizonans disapprove, including 52% who strongly disapprove, of William Perry Pendley being installed as the acting Director of the Bureau of Land Management. Just 32% approve of Pendley's installment.

Other key findings from the survey include:

- A plurality (44%) of Arizona voters say they would view Senator Martha McSally less favorably if she were to remain silent and refuse to answer questions about the unconfirmed acting directors, including Pendley. Just 10% say they would view her more favorably.
- Senator McSally is also underwater in approval when it comes to her management of America's public lands, wildlife, and environment, with 44% of voters disapproving and just 37% approving.
- Both McSally and Trump are underwater in approval in Arizona, with McSally's approval (35-51) slipping behind Trump's (44-52).

Public Policy Polling surveyed 534 Arizona voters from September 16-17, 2020. The margin of error is +/- 4.2%. 53% of interviews for the survey were conducted by text message and 47% by telephone.
